Location and Climate: Flagler College is located in beautiful, historic St. Augustine, Florida. St. Augustine is in northern Florida, just 40 miles (64 km) from Jacksonville, 50 miles (80 km) from Daytona Beach and 107 miles (160 km) from Orlando, Florida. Flagler College is just minutes away from miles of scenic beaches on the Atlantic Ocean as well as walking, hiking, and biking trails. Flagler College is an integral part of St. Augustine's downtown area which offers an abundance of shops, restaurants, art galleries, colonial Spanish architecture, and Ponce de Leon's Fountain of Youth. Scholarships: The Flagler experience is offered at a cost that is almost half that of comparable private colleges and on par with most large public universities. That's why Flagler College is consistently recognized by a variety of respected publications and journals as being one of the best college values in the nation. We do offer merit-based scholarships of \$1,500 - \$4,500 US. These awards are based on an academic rating determined at the time of admission. Students must have an SAT, ACT, TOEFL or IELTS score to qualify for these awards. Athletic scholarships can be awarded to international students as we are members of the NCAA Division II: Men - baseball, basketball, cheer-leading, cross country, golf, soccer, tennis. Admission to Flagler College is selective. Flagler's process of student selection is not solely determined by a matrix of GPA's and test scores. Our goal in the admissions process is to identify those students who appear most likely to benefit from and contribute to the academic and student life programs of our College. The transcript is the most important item in the decision process. The student should have a well-rounded college preparatory program with a better than average grade point average. Of great importance are letters of recommendation and extracurricular activities, as Flagler College seeks students possessing leadership qualities and those who exhibit initiative to be self-starters and contributors to the campus community. SAT/ACT is not a requirement for admission. English Proficiency Requirements: In addition to meeting the regular admission requirements, all applicants from other countries whose native language is not English must demonstrate proficiency in the English language. This can be accomplished by submitting any one of the following – SAT, ACT, TOEFL, IELTS, or passing scores in English on the GCE, GCSE, IGCSE, BGCSE, CXC, CSEC, CAPE, IB examinations or Duolingo English Test. Official scores must be submitted with the application for admission.
