The Center for Global Education offers resources across two categories:

STUDY ABROAD

- 1. Faculty-Led: Organized by faculty, these courses range from 2-6 weeks and include a travel component. They occur during the summer term, or as part of the FlagSHIP program in JanTerm or Maymester.
- 2. Exchange: Students spend a semester abroad studying at an international institution. Students can choose from 8+ international partner institutions.
- 3. Independent: Pre-vetted programs that allow students to independently pursue their interests abroad.
- 4. International Internships: Students can engage in an internship abroad relevant to their academic focus.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS & SCHOLAR SERVICES

- Provides information and aid on immigration, cultural acclimation, and on-campus advocacy for students.
- Manages the Exchange Visitor Program, which facilitates student, professor, and research scholar exchanges between Flagler College and partner institutions.
- Organizes campus-wide, internationally-themed events throughout the academic year.







HOW TO GIVE THE BEST of Both Worlds

Now more than ever, cultural competency is essential to a well-rounded education. Internationalizing Flagler's curriculum will not only foster global citizenship within our campus community, but will propel our institution to the forefront of an increasingly globalized world.

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS:

Provides funding for study abroad trips, independent research in other countries, or international career experiences.

Short-term: \$5,000

Semester-long: \$10,000 - \$20,000

INTERNATIONAL HOSTING:

Allows the College to invite, house, and provision visiting faculty from institutions abroad.

Short-term hosting: \$5,000 Long-term hosting: \$15,000

FACULTY EXCHANGE:

Enables the College to invite professors from international institutions to teach and conduct research on campus during the academic year while also sending Flagler faculty abroad to do the same.

Adjunct Salary: \$3,000 International Flights: \$1,500

Housing: \$5,000 Total: \$9,500

PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT:

Funds global opportunities from internships to immersion, new study abroad projects, and campus internationalization.

Curriculum Creation: \$3,000 - \$5,000
